HOW TO RIDE

ROUTES

Licking County Transit routes run Monday - Friday from 5 AM - 7 PM. Routes run one hour loops. Check the route schedule to see if a route starts at the top or bottom of the hour.

RIDE

All stops are announced. Let the driver know your stop when you board, and give the driver a reminder as your stop gets close.

TRANSFERS & SHARED STOPS


Most routes will connect at the transfer location: **1717 W Main St.**

FARES

Thanks to community funding, there is currently **no fare** to ride!

BIKES

Each bus is equipped with a bike rack on the front of the bus. The rider is responsible for loading and unloading their bike.

SERVICE ANIMALS

Service animals trained to assist with disabilities are welcome on board. Other pets must be in a carrier that fits on the rider's lap.

BUS SIGNS

Please stand near the bus sign when waiting for a bus.

Be at your stop 5 minutes before the scheduled time.



Please do not trespass on private property. e.g. Steps, porches, under awnings, etc.

Soft Stops (no time listed): Drivers stop only if a passenger is waiting.

Hold Stops (time listed): Drivers wait at stop until the scheduled time, unless running late and no one is present.

NB | EB | SB | WB: Abbreviations for compass directions (NB = Northbound)

Express Route: These are used to connect areas that are separated by distance. They only operate during specific hours.

Local Route: These serve the local area that an express route goes to. They typically operate during non-express times and have specific hours.

Route Information: The "Route Information" section on each route page provides key details including days of operation, hours, and peak times.

MOBILITY DEVICES

All vehicles are fully ADA-compliant and feature a lift, designed to accommodate mobility devices like wheelchairs, walkers, scooters, etc.

PERSONAL ITEMS/GROCERIES

All carry-on items are limited to what passengers can bring on the vehicle in one trip and hold on their lap or be safely stowed.

SAFETY

Traveling by public transit is 10 times safer per mile than traveling by automobile.

- A person can reduce their chance of being in an accident by more than 90% by taking public transit as opposed to commuting by their vehicle.

ECONOMIC

87% of trips on public transit have a direct impact on the local economy.

- Every \$1 invested in public transportation generates \$5 in economic returns.
- Every \$1 billion invested in public transportation supports and creates approximately 50,000 jobs.
- An estimated \$39 billion of public transit expenditures flow into the private sector.
- The average household spends 16 cents of every dollar on transportation, and 93% of this goes to buying, maintaining, and operating cars, the largest expenditure after housing.
- An average household can save more than \$13,000 by taking public transportation and living with one less car.

COMMUNITY

45% of Americans have no access to public transportation.

- Transit connects the community to essential jobs, medical appointments, school, grocery shopping, social activities, and so much more.

ENVIRONMENTAL


Public transit saves the United States 6 billion gallons of gasoline annually.



During peak hours, **9:30 AM to 4:30 PM**, buses run every **30 minutes**.



LCT CODE OF CONDUCT

Licking County Transit is a public transportation service for Licking County.

The following code of conduct is in place to ensure our mission of safely connecting people to places and possibilities:

1. **Be Ready:** Please be at your pick-up location five minutes before the scheduled departure time. For questions or assistance, contact scheduling at (740) 670-5185 Option 1.
2. **Have Proper Fare:** Have your exact cash fare or pass ready. LCT does not issue change or refunds. Your operator may deny service if you do not have the proper fare.
3. **Maintain Service Animals:** Service animals trained to assist people with disabilities are welcome on board. Please keep your service animal on a leash. Other animals or pets may ride only if they are in a carrier that fits on your lap. Please ensure that all animals remain well-behaved.
4. **Secure Belongings:** All carry-on items are limited to what passengers can bring on the vehicle in one trip and hold securely or be safely stowed.
5. **Travel Securely:** According to Ohio Law, seatbelts must be used at all times when available in vehicles. This is for the safety of all passengers.
6. **Child Safety:** The law dictates that any child under age 4 or less than 40 pounds in weight; must ride in a child safety seat. Children who outgrow a child safety seat should ride in a booster seat until age 8. Children taller than 4 feet, 9 inches, do not need to use a booster seat, as they should fit into the vehicle's seat belt properly. A parent or guardian must provide the child safety seat(s).
7. **Child Rides:** Children from age 7 up to the age of 18 may travel alone on Demand Response at full fare. Children under 7 must be accompanied by an adult. A parent or guardian must make Reservations for Demand Response trips for children ages 7-12 who are traveling alone.
8. **Secure Mobility Devices:** We ask passengers riding LCT to give priority seating to seniors and people with disabilities. To protect you and your fellow passengers, and to comply with the Americans with Disabilities Act (ADA), the vehicle's operator will secure any mobility device that you have on board. Please cooperate with your operator to ensure everyone has a safe ride.


9. **No Motorized Devices:** Motorized devices, such as a scooter or Segway, are prohibited on the bus. This does not include ADA mobility devices.
10. **Be Considerate:** Cursing/swearing, disruptive behavior, threatening, lewd comments, and/or other inappropriate actions are not tolerated. Assaulting, harassing, or intimidating LCT employees or passengers could cause you to be banned from the vehicle and/or arrested.
11. **Do Not Distract the Operator:** Since your operator's first concern is ensuring you arrive at your destination safely, please avoid prolonged conversations with the operator while the vehicle is in motion.
12. **Turn Off the Volume:** No playing of any audio devices. Loud music and phone conversations can be distracting to the operator and other passengers. The use of devices with headphones is permitted as long as it does not impact others.
13. **Keep It Clean:** LCT requires that customers maintain acceptable hygiene when riding. Please do not expose other passengers to bodily fluids of any kind, or odors that may present health or safety risks. Clothing that covers the body is required (e.g., Shirts, shoes, pants, shorts, skirts, etc.).
14. **No Smoking, Eating, or Drinking:** Passengers are not permitted to eat, drink, smoke, or use e-cigarettes. Please exhale all smoke before boarding. Any food or drink brought on board must be completely covered.
15. **No Drugs or Alcohol:** Using drugs or drinking alcohol on any LCT vehicle and/or property violates LCT policy and Ohio law.
16. **Weapons:** The possession of weapons (or objects intended to be used as weapons) on LCT vehicles and/or LCT property is prohibited, except when such possession is in full compliance with all applicable federal, state, and local laws. When permitted by law, weapons must be carried in a safe and secure manner at all times. LCT reserves the right to take appropriate action if the presence of a weapon is deemed to pose a risk to the safety or comfort of passengers or staff.
17. **No Dangerous Equipment:** Dangerous equipment and/or hazardous materials such as car batteries, gas cans, lawnmowers, paint thinners, etc. are not permitted on any LCT vehicle and/or property.

Take advantage of Emergency Ride Home (ERH).

Riding Licking County Transit just got easier with Gohio Commute's Emergency Ride Home Program (ERH).

What is ERH?

Emergency Ride Home (ERH) is a free service that assures commuters taking alternative modes of transportation to and from work won't be stranded in the case of an emergency, illness, or unexpected overtime. It's a foolproof benefit meant to ease the minds of commuters who carpool or vanpool, bike, or take the bus to work and need to get home quickly.

Register

To enroll in the ERH program, register for an account at Gohiocommute.com/morpc. On the last page of registration, be sure to check the box that reads, "I would like to participate in the Guaranteed/Emergency Ride Home Program." Gohio Commute staff will screen your application and contact you within 72 hours, if approved.

How does it work?

The program allows registered users to take their emergency ride with the licensed rideshare provider of their choice (Uper, Lyft, or a taxi provider). Users will pay for the ride up front and be reimbursed via a mailed check within 4 weeks after uploading their receipt on Gohiocommute.com/morpc.
